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#### **Top Performing Chapter Award**

The MPI Chapter Performance Award is designed to recognize MPI chapters for their achievements in key areas essential to long-term success. Each chapter's performance is evaluated based on three critical factors:



Membership – Growth, retention, and engagement within the chapter community. Finance – Financial stability and sustainability to support operations. Education – Quality programming and professional development opportunities for members.

These measures are tracked through the Chapter Dashboard that is submitted to MPI each month to ensure alignment with MPI Bylaws and Global Policies. This dashboard serves as a snapshot of each chapter's operational health, fiscal sustainability, and member engagement, highlighting strengths and areas for growth. Additionally, chapters earn Metric Incentives based on their performance throughout the fiscal year.

Because of the hard work and dedication of the MPI Philadelphia Area Chapter Board of Directors, Committee Members and engagement of our Members, MPI Philadelphia Area Chapter has earned Top Performing Chapter status for the fifth year in a row!



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#### **Taking a Stand Against Human Trafficking**

In today's world, it's heartbreaking to know that millions — including children — remain trapped in modern-day slavery through human trafficking. MPI stands united with hospitality leaders to raise awareness and take action against this global crisis of sexual and labor exploitation.

What Is Human Trafficking? Human trafficking is the second-largest and fastest-growing criminal industry worldwide, generating \$150 billion annually and affecting over 40 million people — including 5.5 million children. It involves force, fraud, or coercion to exploit individuals through commercial sex or labor. Victims are often controlled through threats, manipulation, or abuse.



Who Are the Victims? According to the International Labour Organization:

- 40.3 million victims globally
- Average age of entry in the U.S.: 13 for girls, 11 for boys
- Vulnerable groups include LGBTQ+ youth, survivors of prior abuse, and runaway/homeless youth

Why Hospitality Must Lead As professionals in travel and hospitality, we have a duty to protect the vulnerable. Traffickers often exploit the anonymity of hotels, airports, and events. Failing to act risks public trust, legal consequences, and the safety of guests and staff.

If You Suspect Trafficking: Do not intervene directly. Instead:

- Observe discreetly and record details (date, time, physical descriptions, vehicle info)
- Report to hotel management, flight crew, or call:
  - 911 for emergencies
















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## Bosses' Night Education: Moving from Panic to Purpose


