METROPLEX CHAPTER MEET SET TO MUSIC

The Chapter's last meeting of the decade was set to music at the Hilton Inn, Thursday, December 27. Suprisingly, an excellent crowd showed up for Tony Brigmon's able performance titled "Music - Your Stress Thermometer".

President Charlotte St. Martin reported that plans had been completed for the January meeting. It will

be an innovative and unique chapter meeting with MPI's INTERFACE program highlighting events. The details are reported elsewhere in Current.

Director George Gallagher reported on the recent MPI Fall Conference in Los Angeles with an explanation about the new dues increase. He also reported on the new rule about new MPI members. New supplier members of MPI who want to attend a national MPI conference must be a member at least four months prior to that conference. George explained that the Board of Directors wanted to try, with this new rule to balance out registrations at future MPI meetings. In the past registrations have been heavy in favor of the supplier members.

Tony Brigmon, who is the Management Development Specialist for Southwest Airlines in Dallas, with guitar, enlightened nearly sixty members and guests. He explained that music can do a number of different things; Lift. . inspire. . focus. . energize. . or relax. It all depends on your objective for a meeting and what part you want the music to play. Tony explained that you must select music to meet your needs and that there are three characteristics--VOLUME--Loud produces great energy; soft produces little energy. TEMPO--determines where energy goes. The fast music tunes us to the physical emotional self; slow music tunes us to the higher self, mental/spiritual. COMPOSITION--The bass relates to the physical/emotional self. Treble relates to the higher self.

Tony followed with several examples which bear repeating. If your delegates are tired, listless, or apathetic and you wish them to be energetic, you should select music with a loud volume, fast tempo, and a well-balanced compositon. Two examples are a polka and Fugue from Swanda. If your delegates are tense, nervous, or excited and you wish them to be calm and relaxed, you should select music with a soft volume and slow tempo. If mentally tense, the music should have more bass. If physically tense, the music should contain more treble. Two examples of this are Barcarolle and Grieg's Morning. If your delegates are mentally/spiritually diffused and you wish more focus concentration, you should select music with a slow volume, slow tempo, and treble
