



thrilling to see those of you who attended. The energy rejuvenated me and propelled me forward into the second half of my term. Thank you to all involved in planning these two special days.


Congratulations to our award winners, and thank you for volunteering!

From the moment I arrived at the Brookfield Conference Center to the time I left, I felt that MPI-WI put my safety, comfort level, and overall needs first.



The Gala was again a huge success! Congratulations to everyone for working so hard for the success of this chapter.






