Happy Summer, MPI-WI!

For those of you that are connected with me on LinkedIn, (or read "Who's in the News" in this publication), you may know of my promotion at Zywave. Although I am proud of the fact that I got this promotion, it was far more significant to me than the new title or the new salary – it marked a pivotal point in my career post-pandemic.

you can take from this is not just a (super scary!) health scare, but a story of overcoming something totally unexpected, during possibly the worst time ever.

FOOD FOR THOUGHT: CHEF JENNIFER KOSCHAK



Short Rib Bolognese Recipe

INGREDIENTS:

- 2 lbs. beef chuck short ribs
- 3 tbsp. canola oil
- 2 stalks celery (finely diced)
- 1 medium carrot (finely diced)
- 1 medium onion (finely diced)
- 4 oz. pancetta (diced)
- 2 cloves garlic (minced)

- 3 tbsp. tomato paste
- 2 sprigs rosemary
- 2 sprigs thyme
- 1 sprig oregano
- ¼ cup heavy cream (optional)
- · Salt and pepper
- 1 package pappardelle pasta

INSTRUCTIONS:

1. Season and Sear:

- Pat dry and season all sides of the short ribs with salt and pepper.
- Heat oil in a Dutch oven or heavy pan over high heat until it shimmers.
- Sear short ribs on all sides until browned (2-3 minutes per side). Transfer to a plate, leaving about 1 tbsp. of oil in the pan.

2. Build the Sauce:

- Cook pancetta over medium-high heat until it starts to brown.
- o Add celery, carrot, and onion, cook for 2 minutes.
- o Add garlic, cook for 1 minute, stirring frequently.
- Reduce heat to medium, add red wine, and scrape the pan. Simmer for 1 minute.
- o Add tomato paste and stir to combine.

3. Cook Low and Slow:

- o Return short ribs to the pan, meaty side down.
- Cover and cook on low heat for 3 to 3 ½ hours, until meat is fork-tender.
- Remove ribs, pull meat off bones, discard gristle, and return meat to the sauce.
- Remove herb sprigs. If desired, stir in heavy cream and simmer for 30 seconds.

4. Cook the Pasta:

 Cook pasta in salted water according to package instructions. Reserve ½ cup pasta water before draining.

5. Combine and Serve:

- Toss pasta with short rib Bolognese. Add reserved pasta water for a thinner sauce if needed.
- Top with cheese and fresh parsley or red pepper flakes for added spice.

Enjoy this hearty and delicious Short Rib Bolognese, a testament to Chef Jennifer Koschak's culinary expertise and Sicilian roots.

Rebecca Staats' Insights and Advice:


