In 10 months I would be the lead on their annual convention in Colorado Springs. It was in a location I had never visited, and held at the world-renowned Broadmoor.

I was beyond excited, but a bit overwhelmed! I had a few challenges I needed to work through. There was a 100 booth exhibit hall, alongside the 550 person conference, \$50,000 speaker, and I needed to direct the show during each general session. The audience was CEOs and leaders of banks in Texas (an audience I knew nothing about, including their private planes); I had to arrange shipping/transportation of all materials to another state, needed to consider the higher altitude to keep guests safe, and had a general session speaker cancel 12 hours before their scheduled speaking time.

Overall, the event went really well thanks to the guidance I had from the awesome venue and experienced co-workers. I will never forget it; I loved it more than anything, and knew I would be in this field for the long haul. I look forward to someday taking another client back to The Broadmoor for another memorable event.
