The Golden State Collaborative

A satewide effort involving all five chapters in California

As this audience of meeting professionals knows – launching a new event takes vision, strategy and leadership....and sometimes more than a year or two to pull off. Well, in the case of California meeting professionals – a new idea went from concept to launch in just seven months. This event brought five MPI chapters together to produce a virtual event for more than 320 industry professionals from across the state.

The planning effort was spearheaded by our very own Rachel Hickerson, MPISSN Past President.

She shared, "This event was sparked from a discussion during a virtual chapter meet-up during the early

stages of the pandemic. We listened to our membership and from there a collaborative was formed across California to plan this statewide event focused on the recovery of meetings in California and beyond." She makes it sound easy, but it truly was a herculean effort involving countless hours, meetings and more than 20 volunteers from all five chapters across California to pull off.

The event was titled, The MPI Golden State Collaborative – Moving Events Forward and was held October 8. An opening panel of DMO CEOs from San Diego, Anaheim, Los Angeles, and San Francisco talked frankly about the challenges and opportunities they've faced this year along with their re-opening strategies. The panel discussion was led by the CEO of Destinations International, Don Welsh. Breakout sessions followed on the topics of contracts, food and beverage, diversity/inclusion, professional development and

digital events. The day concluded with local chapter happy hour meet-ups.

What participants liked about the event:

- Breakouts were repeated so participants could attend two of the five options during the event (and view the others afterward through the recordings)
- Collaborative connection with other industry professionals from across the state
- A moderator who kept the conversation flowing
- An event emcee to kick off the event and provide a flow in between sessions
- The Swapcard platform
- Length of the program (11 am 3 pm)
- High level execs from DMOs speaking directly to the audience
- Interesting breakout topics
- Reasonable pricing
- Live presentations
- Event photo booth

The professionalism and collegial support felt amongst the planning team along with the request for more statewide programming was enough motivation for the group to discuss a potential annual event for the California chapters. Stay tuned for more!






Christine Feenstra has embraced her new virtual world.


